#### 3. **Directors' Report**

SMB summarised the report which had been circulated previously. He said that the year had once again been very busy and highlighted the following matters:

- a) General repairs to the masonry had been carried out under the direction of Richard Andrews, Trust architect.
- b) There had been 30 events during the year. 13 of these had been on site including numerous school visits and guided tours.
- c) Priory by Candlelight in its second year had been even more successful with 1500 visitors and it was hoped to it would be repeated this year.
- e) Southover Bonfire Society and Synergy Theatre had made use of the site.

- f) On behalf of the Trustees he paid tribute to Kate Hickmott, Helen Chiasson, Arthur Franklin, Tony Freeman and Helen Poole for all their guided tours.
- g) A fourth study day entitled Eat, Drink and be Merry had been very successful. Another one was organised on the subject of the Cloister and the Gate on 1 October with distinguished speakers.
- h) The £100,000 Heritage Lottery Grant for the "Putting the Priory on the Map" had now been successfully completed and the final payment received.
- i) Cataloguing Priory stones had progressed and a representative sample is on the Trust website.
- j) The Trust had launched a project to develop a community kitchen garden at Priory Park. The Mayor had kindly made it one of his charities which had already raised £396. Lewes Town Council had granted £1,700 and £230 had been generated by the sponsored walk from Pyecombe Church.
- k) The Banner Project was 50% complete.
- I) A second conference of the UK Cluniac Group had been held in Barnsley in November last year. The group was continuing to develop and the conference this year will be in Dudley.
- m) The European Federation of Cluniac Sites general assembly will take place on 22-24 June in Palencia. Tony Freeman and Kate Hickmott will represent the Trust..
- n) Grateful thanks were expressed to the volunteers who had kept the Herb Garden in such good heart under the guidance of Tracy Anderson.
- o) Thanks were due to Andrew Norris for his work as Membership Secretary and website & social media manger.
- p) Membership had held steady over the last year.
- q) A request for a volunteer to be minute secretary was made.
- r) RE would be retiring as a Trustee. Thanks were expressed to her for all her work over the years.
- t) Tony Freeman would be conducting a tour in Wittenberg in September.

#### 4. Accounts

The Accounts for the year ended 31 March 2016 had been circulated previously to members. SMB has been standing in as treasurer for the last 12 months. He was pleased to announce that Graham Willsher had agreed to take on the role.

SMB reported that, following the completion of the last HLF grant, The Trust assets were around £30,000 which was the average for the last number of years.
